SONS OF NORWAY FOUNDATION IN CANADA

Humanitarian Financial Support Fund



In November 2003, our Foundation established a Fund which purpose is to provide financial relief for Sons of Norway members and other who encounter challenges due to natural disasters affecting their living conditions.

THE HUMANITARIAN FINANCIAL SUPPORT FUND POLICY as approved by the Board of Directors (of the Sons of Norway Foundation in Canada):

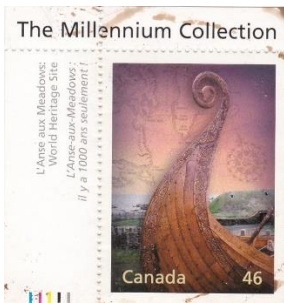
- THE SONS OF NORWAY FOUNDATION IN CANADA Humanitarian Financial Support Fund (also known as the Fund) exists for the purpose of providing financial support to persons who have suffered losses resulting from catastrophic events, as defined in Revenue Canada terms of reference for such events.
- The Fund will accept donations from individuals, groups, or corporations who support this purpose. On decision of the Board of Directors THE SONS OF NORWAY FOUNDATION IN CANADA, the Fund may be supplemented by allocations from the General Fund.
- The Board of Directors of THE SONS OF NORWAY FOUNDATION IN CANADA will determine the duration of a specific "funding project", as well as the deadline date for grant applications.
- Dispersal of the money from the Fund to needy recipients will be in the form of grants.
- Community groups must initiate grant applications to THE SONS OF NORWAY FOUNDATION IN CANADA, which must be supported by their membership with the applications being signed by the President and Secretary. Applications should provide details of the circumstances of need. Grant recipients must be Canadian residents.
- The Board of Directors of THE SONS OF NORWAY FOUNDATION IN CANADA will decide the amounts of each grant from the Fund, and those decisions are final
- Grant application for the humanitarian Financial Support Fund must be sent to the Secretary of THE SONS OF NORWAY FOUNDATION IN CANADA, at the published address.

NOTE: Donations channeled through THE SONS OF NORWAY FOUNDATION IN CANADA to other charitable recipient organizations for a catastrophic event or other channeled designated giving will not be affected by THE SONS OF NORWAY FOUNDATION IN CANADA Humanitarian Financial Support Fund policy.

HISTORY ON THE FEATURED STAMP IN THIS ISSUE



The featured stamp was issued on February 17, 2000 and was part of the Millennium Collection under the heading of L'Anse aux Meadows, World Heritage Sites.

It was printed by Aston Potter, Canada and designed by Susan Warr. There were 1,000,000 printed.

L'Anse aux Meadows is the oldest known European settlement in the New World. It is situated in Newfoundland and was established by Norse colonists a thousand years ago.

If you have never visited this historic site I suggest you put it on your “Bucket List”. It is worth the trip and Newfoundland is a beautiful and friendly place to visit.

In thanking you for your interest and support in the distribution of “Your Foundation News” I discovered a bit of inconsequential trivia about Norway.

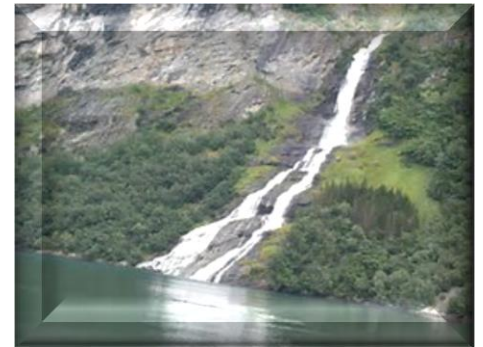
TRIVIA



The Seven Sisters

The Seven Sisters is the 39th tallest waterfall in Norway. The waterfall consists of seven separate streams and the tallest of the seven has a free fall of 250 meters.

The Seven Sisters is located on the northern side of Geirangerfjorden and directly across the Fjord lies a single waterfall called “The Suitor”. The legend of the Seven Sisters is that they dance playfully down the mountain. Meanwhile across the Fjord, the Suitor flirts playfully with them from afar.

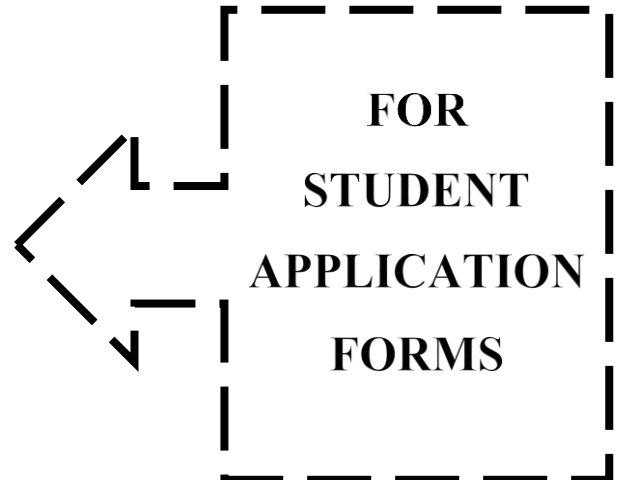
